

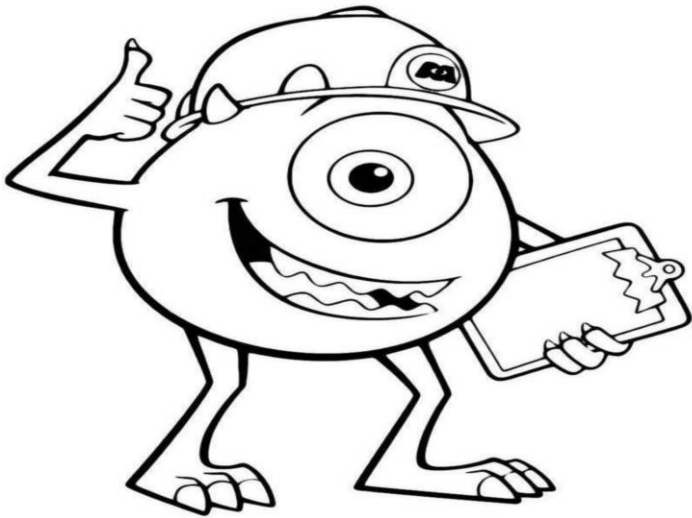

RULES:

- **Exhibits must arrive at the Fair from 6 pm to 9 pm on the Thursday before the Fair.**
- **Exhibits are to be picked up the Monday morning after the Fair between 9 & 11 am.** (Exhibits not picked up within two weeks of the Fair closing will become the property of the Society).
- **All rules of the Fair shall apply.** (See Main Booklet)

***** ARTS & CRAFTS *****

Chairperson – Dorothy Edwards

Class ----- Description

A. Ages 5 and under (*at fair time*)

- 1) A collection of stickers – animal theme.
- 2) Sponge painting of a tractor.
- 3) Design a barn with buttons - maximum 12” x 18”.
- 4) Create a playdough owl displayed on a small disposable paper plate.
- 5) Using a clothespin make and decorate a reindeer.
- 6) Cut & paste a flower - mounted 8 1/2” x 11”.
- 7) Print “**Your Name**” and decorate - 6” x 12” Bristol board.

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- 8) The largest maple leaf – mounted on 8½“x 11” paper.
- 9) A collection of stones in a 6-section egg carton.

B. Ages 6 to 8 years. (at fair time)

- 10) Print “**Lombardy Fair**” and decorate - 6” x 12” Bristol board.
- 11) Printing – copy the poem “**Hickory Dickory Dock**”:
Hickory dickory dock
The mouse ran up the clock
The clock struck one
The mouse ran down
Hickory dickory dock.
- 12) Create a butterfly using coffee filters.
- 13) Make a Christmas decoration.
- 14) Make a snowman - any medium.
- 15) Design a quilt block using foam pieces – Size 12” x 12”.
- 16) A collage of farm animals - ½ sheet of Bristol board.
(completely cover your board)
- 17) Decorate a mitten.
- 18) Make an inukshuk from stones.



SPECIAL: Open to all children ages 8 years and under (at fair time)

- 19) Make a lego tractor – displayed on a paper plate.

C. Ages 9 to 12 years. (at fair time)

- 20) Make a Christmas decoration.
- 21) A pencil sketch – colour may be used.
- 22) 4 photos taken by “Me” - mounted.
- 23) Celebrate the “**The New Royal Baby**” using written and/or pictures – mounted on ½ sheet of Bristol board.
- 24) Make a welcome sign – maximum 18”.

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25) In cursive handwriting copy this poem:

Whisky, Frisky

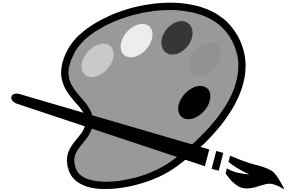
*Whisky, frisky, hippity, hop,

*Furly, curly, what a tail!

- 26) Make a decorated park bench out of popsicle sticks.
- 27) A canvas painting using acrylic paint – max. 16" x 20".
- 28) Any craft not mentioned – max. 12" x 18"

D. Ages 13 to 16 years. (at fair time)

- 29) A canvas painting using acrylic paint – max. 16" x 20".
- 30) Make a birdhouse.
- 31) Celebrate “**Your Family**” using written and/or photos - mounted on ½ sheet of Bristol board.
- 32) A pencil sketch – colour may be used.
- 33) A hand painted T-shirt.
- 34) Decorate an unopened non-perishable box or can of food as a gift for the food bank. (all entries to be donated to the local food bank)
- 35) Make a Christmas decoration from nature.
- 36) Any small hand-made craft.
- 37) A computer generated cartoon character.



SPECIAL: Open to all children ages 9 to 16 years (at fair time)

- 38) An article made from duct tape.

Open to all children to age 16 (at fair time)

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- 39) Any craft made from fabric, yarns, and /or threads.
- 40) Create a person out of nuts, bolts, screws., etc. – no larger than 10”.
- 41) A popsicle ferris wheel structure on a sturdy base – not to exceed 12”in any direction.
- 42) Melted crayon art design.

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*** O.A.A.S. Youth Poster Competition ***

Entry Rules:

- a) **“Promoting Your Fair”** – Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
 - b) Must be hand drawn.
 - c) Poster size:
 - Minimum – 22cm X 28cm, without border.
 - Maximum – 28cm X 44cm, without border.
 - d) **Each entry must be centered on CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD exposing a 5.5 cm. border on all four sides.**
 - e) **Name of fair, district# (2), contact person, owner of poster and complete mailing address must be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.**
 - f) The winning poster from each class at each fair will be eligible to enter the district competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition (see competitions at <http://ontarioagsocieties.com/member-services/competitions> for details)
 - g) **Judging Standards:**
 - Overall Appearance – 50 points
 - Hand Drawn – 35 points
 - OAAS Criteria (size, material, theme) – 15 points
- 84) Junior Poster, youth up to and including grade 4.
- 85) Intermediate Poster, youth Grade 5 to Grade 8 inclusive.
- 86) Senior Poster Grade 9 to Grade 12 inclusive.
