- 1) 6 Beans, - Tip & stem attached.
- 2) 6 Beans, novelty - variety named, Tip & stem attached.
- 3) 3 Beets, red globe - tops trimmed to 2.5 cm.
- 4) 3 Beets, novelty - variety named, tops trimmed to 3 cm.
- 5) Broccoli, 1 head.
- 6) Cabbage, 1 head.
- 7) 3 Carrots, table use - tops trimmed to 2.5 cm.
- 8) 3 Ears Sweet Corn – 1/3rd husk removed, variety named.
- 9) 3 Ears Sweet Corn – silk & 1/3rd husk removed.
- 10) Cucumbers - 4 pickling, 5-10 cm, stem attached.
- 11) Cucumbers - 3 slicing, 15 cm. and over, stem attached
- 12) Lettuce – variety named.
- 13) Kale - 4 stems.
- 14) 3 Leeks - tops 10-15cm, roots neatly trimmed.
- 15) 5 Onions, white for bunching.
- 16) 3 Red Onions - unpeeled, trimmed roots & tops.
- 17) 3 Spanish Onions - unpeeled, trimmed roots & tops.
- 18) 5 Peas, Edible pod.
- 19) 2 Peppers, sweet - stem attached.
- 20) 2 Hot Peppers - variety named, stem attached.
- 21) 1 Squash, summer - Stem attached.
- 22) Tomatoes, Cherry - 1 cluster, variety named.
- 23) 3 Tomatoes, table - variety named.
- 24) 3 Heritage Tomatoes - variety named.
- 25) 3 Tomatoes, plum.
- 26) 3 Garlic bulbs.
- 27) Parsley bouquet – in decorated can of water.
- 28) 3 Red Potatoes - variety named.
- 29) 3 White Potatoes - variety named.
- 30) 3 Rhubarb stems - pulled, leaf trimmed to 5 cm.
- 31) A watermelon.
- 32) Any vegetable not listed in a previous class.
- 33) Maple syrup – from a hobby operation of 500 or less taps.
- 34) “Do you see what I see?” - A vegetable that looks like something else. Please name what you think it looks like.
- 35) “Picked from the garden” A basket of garden produce.
